

Here's How to Connect to **BU Secure Wireless!**

Use the instructions below for your computer. For a wired connection, refer to the instructions on the back.

1. 2. 3. 4	On the Start screen, move your mouse to the right corner of the screen. Click the Settings gear in the sidebar menu that appears. Click the wireless bars icon. It should be labeled "Available". Under Wi-Fi, select BU Secure Wireless
